WHO ARE THE HIGHLANDERS?

Do you know people with the name Campbell, Mc-Neill, or Stewart? Everyone has seen a Presbyterian church. These names and this religion denomination are two of the legacies of Highland Scots.

The highlands are a rugged land of mountainous, rocky terrain and harsh winters. The people who inhabited this remote wilderness were known as Highlanders. Highlanders are descendants of Celts who settled in the northern mainland and islands of Scotland. They were self sufficient and independent and the landscape promoted isolation and independence.

Because of the remoteness from trade routes it

was a poor region where oatmeal and beef were staple foods. Up to and into the early 1700's Highland society was structured along a close knit tribal clan system. Clan members were related by blood to the clan chief who provided land for them to farm. In turn they gave him obedience, military service and land rents. They became proficient cattle breeders. Their wealth lay in the clan, its fighting force, and their cattle.

In the mid eighteenth century Scotland experienced changes that resulted in a mass exodus of highlanders to other countries. It began with the defeat of the Highland army of "Bonnie Prince Charlie" at Culloden Moor in 1746 at the hands of English forces. After the battle the English took weaons from the highlanders forbidding clan members to give military service to their chief. Clans were put under the jurisdiction of English law, rather than their chief. They were forbidden to wear Highland native tartans, or plaids. All schooling was required to be conducted in English rather than their native Gaelic language. The playing of bagpipes was not allowed. This and other forces contributed to the emmigration of many Scots from the Highlands.
